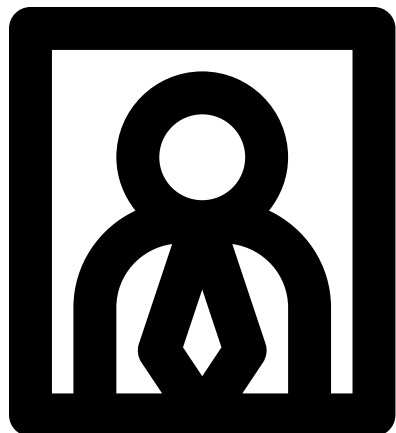


Judging Criteria

Ideas are original and imaginative, presenting groundbreaking ideas. The work stands out as exceptional, leaving a lasting impression on judges.



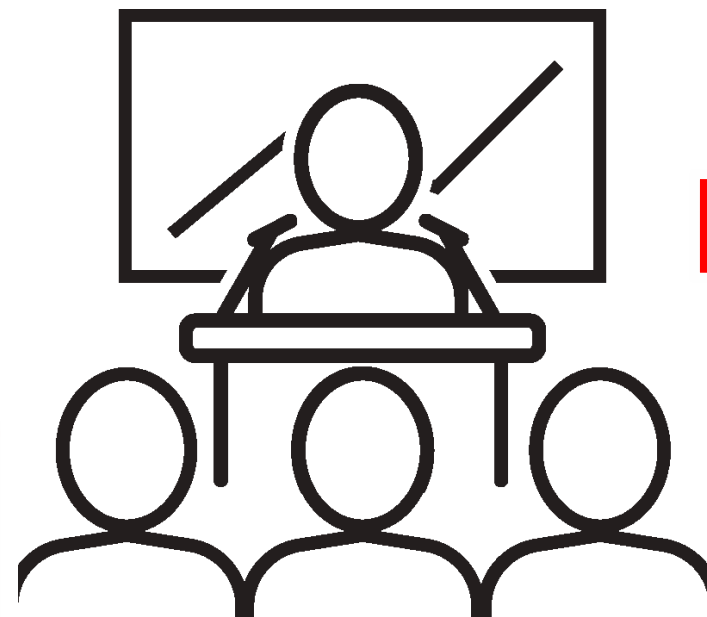

Exudes positivity and embodies strong values and inspires others. The contents consistently promotes kindness, compassion, and optimism.

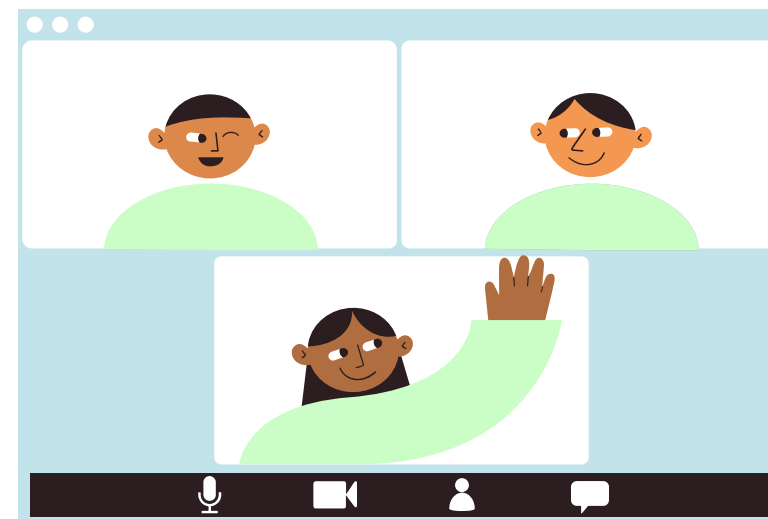

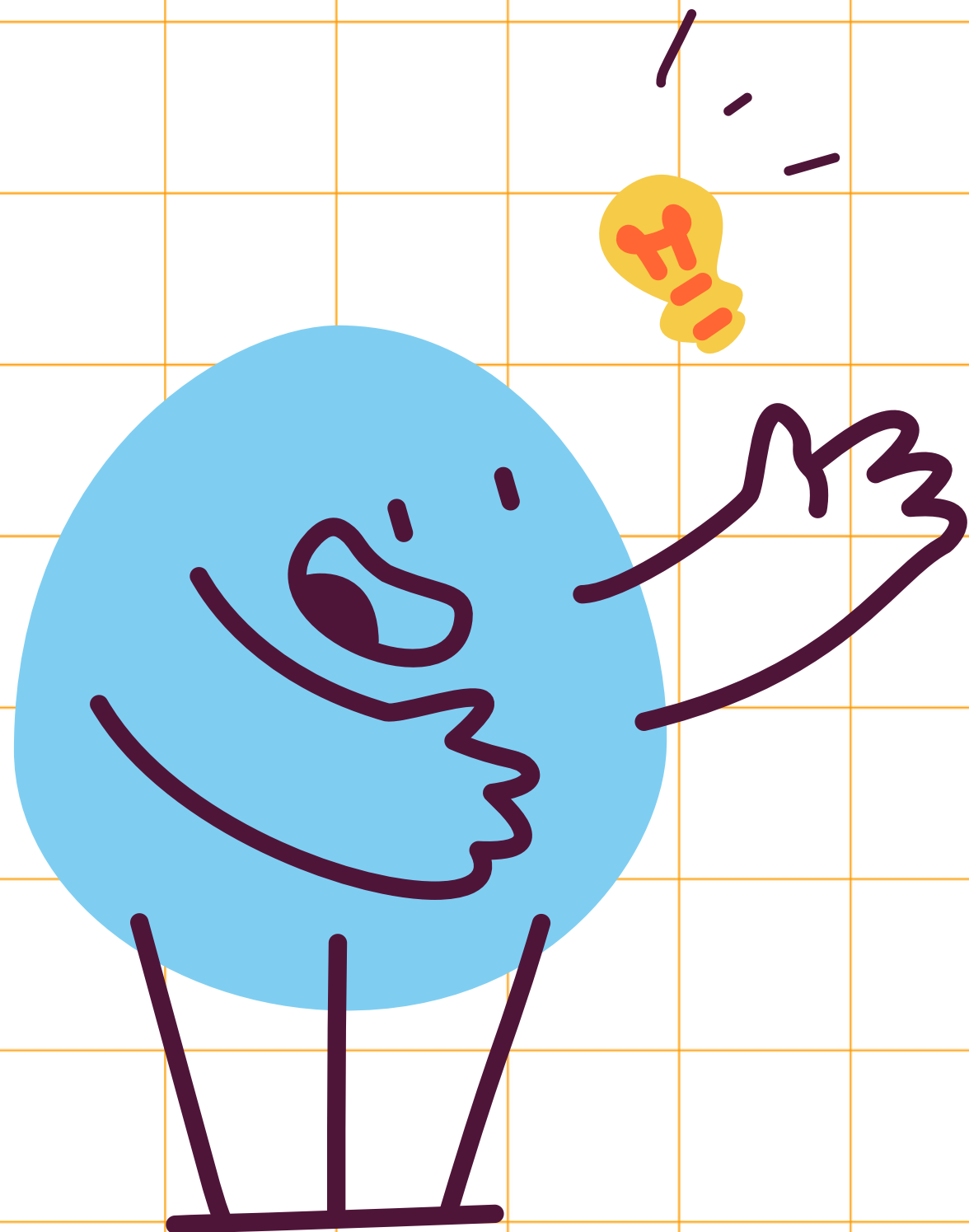

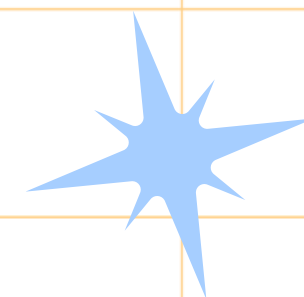

Writing an appealing speech

Start with a strong opening that grabs attention – Asking rhetorical questions

Have you ever told a lie just to avoid trouble? Or kept a secret because the truth felt too hard to say? Honesty isn't always easy, but it's always important. Today, I want to talk about why being honest matters, not just in school or at home, but in shaping who we are and how others see us.

Start with a strong opening that grabs attention – Using anecdotes


It started with a missing wallet in class. Everyone was whispering, guessing, accusing. I knew who had taken it but I stayed silent. I didn't lie, but I didn't tell the truth either. That moment taught me something powerful: honesty isn't just about speaking; it's about standing up for what's right, even when it's uncomfortable.

Infusing 'Positive Mindset & Values' in your speech





Gratitude, as I understand it, is to recognize and appreciate the good things in our lives. It's more than just saying "thank you"; it's about feeling thankful and showing it through our actions. When we practise gratitude, we become more aware of the kindness around us, and we build stronger relationships. It helps us stay positive, even when things aren't perfect. Gratitude makes life richer.

Define – Explain – Elaborate (DEE)

Responsibility means taking ownership of your actions and doing what needs to be done. It's about being dependable and making choices that show you care about others and yourself. For example, if you borrow a friend's book, returning it in good condition shows responsibility. Looking after a pet, keeping your promises, or organizing a group project so everyone succeeds...these actions prove you can be trusted. Responsibility helps you earn respect and prepares you for leadership.

Use authentic examples to enrich your speech

Last weekend, I promised my best friend I'd help with her science project. Saturday came, and my badminton team asked me to join an extra practice. It was tempting, but I remembered my promise. I spent the afternoon working on her project instead. Seeing her smile reminded me that **responsibility** means honoring commitments - even when it's hard.

During art class, my painting was chosen to be displayed on the school notice board. Everyone congratulated me, and some even said I was the best artist in class. Instead of bragging, I told them the truth...my friends gave me great ideas for colors and design. **Humility** means appreciating others' contributions and knowing success is never just yours.

Last night, I noticed my mom and dad were tired after work. Instead of playing games right away, I helped set the table and washed the dishes after dinner. Later, I even asked them about their day. **Filial piety** isn't only about big sacrifices; it's about small acts of care that show respect and love for our parents every day.

End with a motivational call to action

Imagine a classroom where everyone feels safe to share ideas, no matter how different they are. That starts with you. **Tolerance** - listen before judging; ask questions instead of making assumptions; and treat differences as strengths. **Today, let's make a promise:** be the person who builds bridges, not walls. Together, we can create a community where everyone belongs.

Respect is more than politeness; it's the foundation of trust and harmony. Begin by listening when others speak, valuing their opinions, and treating everyone with dignity. Respect your teachers, classmates, and even those you disagree with. When you show respect, you inspire others to do the same. **Let's make respect the rule, not the exception, starting today.**

Show your love for your country through action: learn its history, respect its culture, and contribute positively to its future. Small steps, like caring for public spaces, make a big difference.

Organization and time management

Important tips for speech delivery

1. Rehearse before your actual delivery

Practise multiple times to get comfortable with the flow and timing.

2. Structure your speech clearly

Divide it into sections (e.g., introduction, main points, conclusion) and allocate time to each.

3. Practise pausing

Strategic pauses help with pacing and give you time to think without rushing.

4. Allow a buffer

You may speak faster or slower during the actual performance, so leave some flexibility in your timing.

5. Avoid reciting the whole speech

Leave some room for improvising as it can be stressful for you to recite the whole speech.
